Stop 3 Gravel pit north of Piscataway, 0.5 miles south of Ford Flant, on Route 1. (See large gneiss boulder; periglacial action, etc.)

Stop 4 South of New Brunswick. Route 25 two miles east of U.S. 1. (See large boulder.)

Stop 5 Dunhams Corners (Locality for fossil plants).

Stop 6 Crossman Pit, Parlin. (Pensauken overlying Raritan)

Stop 7 New pit (Villa Contracting Co.) 2 miles SW of Ernston. (Fresh exposure on Pensauken)

Stop 8 Glenrock Concrete Products Company, Jamesburg. (See Faleozoic fessils in chert pebbles.

Stop 9 Along road between Monmouth Junction and Kingston. (See boulders from the Pensauken)

Stop 10 North side of Rocky Hill on Route 31 (boulders on Triassic).

Stop 11 3 miles north Rocky Hill on Route 31 (thin layer of sand and boulders capping hill, inversion of topography?

Stop 12 3 miles SW Millstone (Blue charts in Pensauken on top of hill, overlying Triassic).
