PROPOSED ITINERARY FOR TRIP OF "FRIENDS OF THE FLEISTOCENE"

Meeting Place
9:00A.M.
May 21, 1949

Pensauken gravel
The Howard Johnson Restuarant on southeast side of U.S. Route 1 just south-west Woodbridge Clover-leaf. (Near intersection Route 1 and State Route 35.)

- Step 1 Valentine pit at Maple Hill Dairy Farm near Woodbridge. (See 10' of Wisconsin till overlying 15' of Pensauken.)
- Step 2 Meadow Road (Old Post Road) just southeast of Piscataway. (Note cross-bedding and periglacial structure.)
- Step 3 Gravel pit north of Piscataway, 0.5 miles south of Ford Plant, on Route 1. (See large gneiss boulder; periglacial action, etc.)
- Step 4 South of New Brunswick. Route 25 two miles east of U.S. 1. (See large boulder.)
- Step 5 Dunhams Corners (Locality for fossil plants).
- Step 6 Crossman Pit, Parlin. (Pensauken overlying Raritan)
- Step 7 New pit (Villa Contracting Co.) 2 miles SW of Ernston. (Fresh exposure on Pensauken)
- Step 8 Glenrock Concrete Products Company, Jamesburg. (See Paleozoic fossils in chert pebbles.)
- Step 9 Along road between Monmouth Junction and Kingston. (See boulders from the Pensauken)
- Step 10 North side of Rocky Hill on Route 31 (boulders on Triassic).
- Step 11 3 miles north Rocky Hill on Route 31 (thin layer of sand and boulders capping hill, inversion of topography?)
- Step 12 3 miles SW Millstone (Blue cherts in Pensauken on top of hill, overlying Triassic).

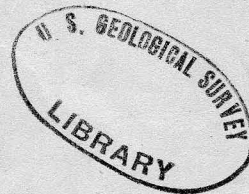
DINNER - Nassau Tavern, Princeton

- Station 13 1 mile SE Princeton Junction. Percussion series on Pensauken boulders.
- Station 14 1 mile SE Clarksville. deep red weathering of Pensauken. (*Pensauken soil*)
- Station 15 Broad street Park Eastern outskirts of Trenton. Low level Pensauken and Cape May lying on it.
- Station 16 1 mile SW Clarkeburg. Pensauken capping hills.
- Station 17 1 mile East of Allaire, Bridgeton.
- Station 18 1 mile SW of Belmar. Pensauken below the Bridgeton but rising above Cape May coastal plain.
- Station 19 Neptune City, Boston Road. Cape May formation.
